

At Greenbank Farm

Grants Fuel Improvements

Nearly \$100,000 has been procured to fund improvements at Port properties. Thanks to Puget Sound Energy, \$15,000 in interior lighting upgrades have been completed at Greenbank Farm, reducing energy usage and costs. Awards through Island County's Rural Economic Development Program will support three critical projects: \$46,000 for farm pond restoration; \$18,000 to replace roof sections on the main barn; and \$10,000 will repair a failed rafter at the Wharf.
