Public Weighs In On Farm's Off Leash Dog Area

At the November meeting of the Port Board of Commissioners, more than 50 community members voiced their support and concerns for maintaining the off-leash dog area at Greenbank Farm. A number of suggestions arose, including volunteer patrols, gated entrances and improved signage. The Port has proposed fencing some of the off-leash area to protect leased farm land and crops. The Port will continue to seek input on farm land use, with plans for a survey in early 2020.
