Coupeville Chosen as a "Friendliest Town" in the US





Port Seeks New Commissioner for District 3 (Greenbank Area)



We encourage those interested in our local maritime and farm heritage to consider becoming a Port Commissioner! This position in District #3 requires a Commissioner who lives in the District #3 boundaries (the orange section on the map).

The Port of Coupeville owns and manages three properties: the Coupeville Wharf, 24 Front Street (old

Gillespie's Meat Market and currently Collections Boutique), and the Greenbank Farm.

As a port commissioner, you are responsible for the health and future of these historic properties, as well as the economic vitality and growth within the

communities we serve. Each Commissioner serves a four-year term, must be a legal adult and reside in District #3.

Coupeville Wharf Public Dock

The historic Coupeville Wharf in Penn Cove is a popular destination for visitors, and also a favorite for photographers and artists. Not everyone realizes the wharf is also a public dock for travelers by boat. For more than 100 years, the wharf has welcomed visitors by sea. The wharf was recently featured in Welcome Home magazine's article about traveling the Puget Sound by boat:

During summers, the wharf is home to the historic schooner, the Suva that takes passengers out for a sail to experience the spectacular Penn Cove.
