



Penn Cove Ecosystem Monitoring Project



The Port of Coupeville has been invited by King County to partner on an exciting new science project to monitor the "biogeochemistry" of Penn Cove.

Biogeochemistry is **the study of how chemical elements flow through living systems and their physical environments**. It investigates the factors that influence cycles of key elements such as carbon, nitrogen and phosphorous.

Sensors and solar panels will be installed at monitoring stations around the Coupeville wharf. Stay tuned for more information as the project progresses.

Introducing Port of Coupeville's New Commissioner – John Callahan
